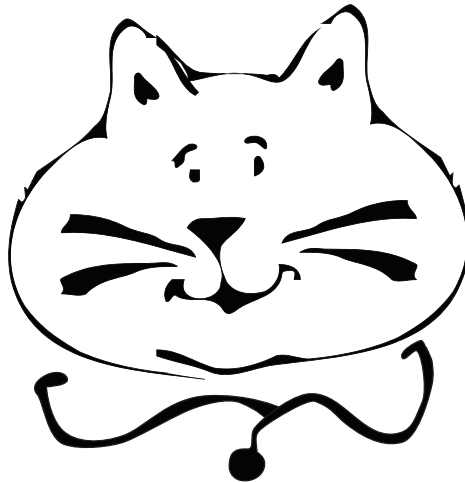
Thankful for Our Valued Veterinary Partners

The success of keeping our adoption center cats healthy and providing the Stitch in Time program comes from the wonderful veterinary support we enjoy. Feline Specialties is the vet for our adoption center cats and four other veterinary practices help us provide low cost spay/neuter/vaccinate vouchers for 69 homeless cats per month. They are Kindness Animal Hospital, Best Friends Veterinary Hospital, Cedarwood Veterinary Clinic, and Riverbrook Animal Hospital.



Feline Specialties
Feline Specialties,
9702 Riverside Pkwy,
began a relationship

with StreetCats in 2000. Dr. Jennifer O’Cain said they were looking for a way to contribute services to the Tulsa cat community as they only treat cats and StreetCats seemed like the perfect fit since we both clearly have a passion for cats.



All cats coming in to StreetCats for adoption are taken first to Feline Specialties for a general examination and any required tests/treatments before being cleared to enter the StreetCats adoption center. They also work closely with the StreetCats staff to treat any issues that arise with the cats during their stay at StreetCats. For example, Juliana was diagnosed with hyperthyroidism while in our care in 2019 and Feline Specialties has the capability to do the specialized radioactive iodine treatment for hyperthyroidism. Juliana responded well to it and was adopted soon after her treatment was complete.

Several of the Feline Specialties staff have adopted furry family members from us and Chuck (the resident Feline Specialties clinic cat) is an adoption from StreetCats as well. At Christmas, Feline Specialties does a special fundraising event for their clients where they can “adopt” cat angel ornaments with all proceeds going to StreetCats.

all in their name. She has a passion for kindness and respect for all animals, as well as stopping overpopulation. They treat cats, dogs, birds and exotics and have been working with StreetCats since they opened about eleven years ago. There are four veterinarians in the practice and all do surgeries, but Dr. Hurst has a reputation in the region for doing the more difficult surgeries, like knee repairs in dogs and paw repairs after declaw problems. In fact, sometime after she had gotten involved with StreetCats she was visiting us and noticed that one of our cats, Adam, was walking funny. He also had a habit of biting unexpectedly while sitting on your lap. After examining him, she determined that his declaw procedure had left a bone spur which was causing him pain and she fixed it for him. After that he stopped biting as he was no longer in pain and then was adopted to a new home. About a year ago she rescued a cat from SpayOK who had died during a spay, but they had revived it. However, the cat had brain damage and neurological problems causing her to be blind and have difficulty walking so they brought her to Kindness to be put down. Instead, Dr. Hurst kept the cat to be a shop cat. She stays in Dr. Hurst’s office during the day, but can roam free at night and seems to do quite well. They named her Angel or AJ because she was brought back for more love and she lives with their other two shop cats.

vet clinic where she had worked in high school had done so. She said she likes that our Stitch in Time program helps control the population of unwanted cats. Dr. Best knew she wanted to be a veterinarian since she was in kindergarten or first grade.

Best Friends treats cats, dogs, birds, and exotics but they are also working toward certification as a Fear Free practice. They use pheromones to decrease stress in the animals who visit instead of muscling them through the exam. For example, the owner may use a transdermal gel or spray the carrier with Feliway spray to calm it down on the trip to the vet. Once at the office, they spray paper with the pheromone, use wipes, and room diffusers. These pheromones are the same kind that their mothers use to calm their babies so it is a natural way to help the animals destress and lessen the anxiety of everyone during the treatment.

Cedarwood Veterinary Clinic

Dr. Robert Poteet at Cedarwood Veterinary clinic, 1412 S. Harvard, has been in business for 52 years and has been working with StreetCats since September 1998. He doesn't recall how we started working together, but over the years he has supported a variety of animal rescue groups. He treats dogs, cats, birds and occasionally a pocket animal, but he said he does a lot of cats. Dr. Poteet said that he has always liked working with animals and people who like animals, so he doesn't find that his job is work at all.

Over the years he has seen a lot of changes in veterinary practices, especially in technical developments. In the earlier days he had to send all his tests out to a lab and x-rays were more cumbersome. Nowadays many test results are achieved in the office and there is digital radiology and ultrasonography imaging so that they can take pictures while the animal is on the table and make treatment decisions immediately. He also doesn't handle many emergencies these days since there are ER hospitals that not only treat but monitor the patients more effectively. These technological advancements keep Dr. Poteet motivated and interested to continue practicing and he said he is still going strong.

Riverbrook Animal Hospital



Dr. Jana Layton, of Riverbrook Animal Hospital, 3750 S. Peoria, didn't start out to be a veterinarian. After getting a degree in biology she worked at her Dad's farm with the cattle. The vet working with them suggested she would be a good veterinarian so she went back to school and it turned out to be a great fit with her love of animals. She has been at Riverbrook since 2007 and purchased it in 2009.

She said she didn't grow up with cats and didn't even like them until she worked in a cat hospital and began to realize they weren't just small dogs and had their own set of issues related to treatment. Cats are a challenge because they are especially good at hiding problems and not always pleasant to take to the vet, so they don't always get the care they need. Now cats have a special place in her heart and while Riverbrook sees a lot of dogs, she also sees a lot of cats in her practice.

Dr. Layton's passion is around education and communications with her clients to understand the why behind her recommendations. Being a partner in our Stitch in Time program fits well with her prevention philosophy because it provides a low-cost option for people trying to curb overpopulation of cats.

Benefits of adopting a bonded pair of cats

Do you know how much fun it is to spend time with your best friend? That's what a bonded pair of cats feels when they get to go home together. A bonded pair contains two cats that have a special relationship and seek a home that will adopt them together. They may have been raised as siblings or were homed together as companions for several years. It may seem like a larger task to take on a bonded pair of cats when you are considering adopting a new member to your home, but in a lot of ways, it is so much easier.

Despite their independent natures, cats are social creatures that need companionship to thrive. Left alone, a cat can develop behavioral problems, and in some cases, even show signs of depression. Cats in bonded pairs, on the other hand, are more likely to be better adjusted. Much of this comes from how the two interact and share day-to-day activities, like eating and playing together, and finding comfort in each other.

Additionally, cats that come in pairs tend to be healthier and live longer than single cats because they often get more exercise, which keeps their hearts healthy and reduces their stress. Exercise also lessens the risk of having an overweight pet.

Adopting a bonded pair may facilitate the introduction to a new home. The stress of learning a new environment is lessened because the pair have each other to lean on while getting to know you. If you have other cats in your household already, it may lessen the competition for "top cat in the house."

While there will be more expense in feeding and caring for two cats, the daily work of feeding and cleaning litter boxes is not much different than for one cat.

Best reason to adopt a bonded pair: Double the love.
