Solving Litter Box Problems

A host of circumstances could explain why your cat might be missing the litter box. Sometimes it's a behavioral problem, but sometimes a health condition may cause your cat to go outside its box. If left unchecked, a health issue, such as a urinary tract infection, can lead to a potentially life-threatening condition for your cat. A visit to your vet is a good first step in solving the problem but here are additional ideas.

Wrong litter box. Choose a box that is one-and-a half times your cat's length. Some cats like the privacy of a covered box but many senior or disabled cats may have difficulty getting into and out of a deep or covered box.

Wrong Box Location. If it's near a door or in a part of the house that gets a lot of traffic or there are scary sounds and smells or it's in a tight space that's hard to get into and out of, the cat may avoid it. Also, place

the box on the level of the home where your cat spends the majority of its time to avoid difficult stairs or a long commute. Locate the box well away from food and water bowls.

Not enough litter boxes. The optimal number of litter boxes is one for each cat plus one more. Note that the boxes need to be in totally different places in case you have a cat or dog who might be "guarding" the box to keep other cats out.

Smelly Litter Box. Scoop clumps from the litter box daily and deep clean it frequently. This means disposing of the old litter, scrubbing the empty box with mild dish soap and warm water, rinsing it with clean water, letting it air-dry, and pouring in a fresh supply of clean, unscented litter (sometimes scented litter is unappealing to finicky cats).

Litter choice. Cats tend to prefer ground litter granules and some may have aversions to scented or highly dusty products. Others may prefer paper or other natural products. There is a litter called Cat Attract that can be used to encourage your cat to use the box. Whatever litter you and your cat can agree on stick with it consistently. You could set up several different boxes with different litter to see what your cat likes.

If, in spite of your best efforts, your cat goes outside the litter box for any reason, thoroughly clean the area with an enzymatic cleaner so your kitty doesn't catch the scent and think it's OK to go there again.

Pet Your Cat More to Benefit Both of You

One of the first things you do with a cat is to offer your hand to pet it. The most obvious reason we love to pet our cats is because they are soft and the purrs that often follow bring happiness to both of you, but it turns out that there are even more benefits to petting your cat—both for her and for you! As if you needed any extra reasons or incentives to pet your cats, here are a few reasons to justify the experience.

· Communicate love

Petting is one of the best ways that you can communicate your love to your cat. There's no mistaking what your caresses and scratches mean. And in turn, she can communicate her love through nudges and purring.

Reduce stress

Cats make great therapy animals because studies have shown that petting a cat can reduce stress and anxiety, plus help lower blood pressure! Can we get "three purrs" for that?

Detect fleas and ticks

When you pet your cat often, you'll be more familiar with her body and coat. That'll help you notice if there are any creepy crawlers trying to make a meal out of your kitty. Fleas, especially, multiply fast. Noticing them quickly can help you eliminate the problem before it gets out of control.



Detect new cuts or bumps

Petting your cat often will also help you notice changes in her body that may not be visible under her coat, like scratches, bumps, or patches of dry skin. Noticing these changes can help guide you to action—whether that's simply keeping an eye on it or making an appointment with your veterinarian.

Detect tenderness

Since cats are masters at hiding pain, you may not even notice that your cat's left leg is feeling tender until you pet her and your touch elicits a flinch or whimper. Being clued into an injury can help you

take the steps necessary (likely through a visit with your veterinarian) to manage her pain and get her on the road to healing.

However, remember that not all petting sessions are created equal. Many cats don't like to be petted on the belly, for instance, because it can make them feel too vulnerable. Instead, stick to her chin, the base of her ears, and her cheeks—tried and true places that most cats loved to be scratched—and other places by mutual agreement.
