StreetCats Celebrates 25th Anniversary

25th Anniversary

StreetCats started May 1, 1997. Jodi Lorimor, Sara Sparks, and I saw a need for another cat rescue group in Tulsa as we were volunteering for Friends of Felines at the time. Too many kitties were finding their way to the Tulsa City Animal Shelter and were being euthanized because of lack of space. We decided to help people who had to rehome their cat or find homes for adoptable cats on the street. Our first fundraiser was an Ice Cream Social at Jodi's house and we had a "name the cat" contest for our first StreetCat, who became Licorice, a small black male I found abandoned on airport property. We rented space from a Jenks Veterinarian and showed our cats at the Flea Market and PetSmart. We came up with the fundraiser name Furry Valentine around the year 2000. The event has been held at Harweldon, among others, but the longest run and most memorable have been at the Historical Society until 2018. We also



rented a space in the Farm Shopping Center where we could house our cats and show them, but we moved into our present location in 2007. There are so many good memories with the many volunteers who have worked at StreetCats. There are three things I'm most proud of: 1) we have always been all volunteers, 2) run by donations only, and 3) our Stitch In Time Program. There have been thousands of cats for whom we have issued spay/neuter vouchers over the years at low cost. We pay the remainder of the veterinary bill for spaying, neutering and giving rabies vaccines when vouchers are used for homeless cats. Unfortunately, since COVID started we have also not done An Affair of the Heart, a twice per year event that we always participated in, but everything we would be selling at that event we do sell in our boutique area at StreetCats. We don't have all the numbers, but we found homes for 1,635 cats between 2004 and 2021. This is just an outline of what we've accomplished over the years and the years have just flown by with many happy endings.

VOLUNTEER SPOTLIGHT – Vicki Anderson

Are you the person who called me? Are you the person who assigns vouchers? Did I talk to you? These are questions we get in StreetCats so here is her face and info about her to answer these questions. Vicki Anderson is the volunteer who takes and replies to all phone calls on our message line about purchasing vouchers, taking in cats, and more. Vicki has been a volunteer for about 10 years and while taking care of the phone line is a very busy task, she also volunteers in StreetCats weekly on Thursday mornings and one Sunday morning a month, writes newsletter articles, and edits this newsletter. For someone who didn't know she was a cat lover until many years ago when her young daughter convinced her to adopt a cat and she ended up with two, she's come a long way!

After the loss of the original kitties, she found StreetCats for her kitty fix and finally she and her husband, who wanted a lap cat, rescued a senior cat before he passed away. That cat is Anya and she is now 16 years old.

Anya is a very affectionate cat and she spends every evening on Vicki's lap while she crochets animals and watches TV. Vicki also quilts, line dances at the Broken Arrow Senior Center, and is social chairman for her gated community.

Vicki enjoys making sure the StreetCats' cats have a good place to transition from their old home to a new one and helping our customers. "It's not easy coming into StreetCats for some cats who have never been around other cats, but we try to give them love and protection while we find them a new home." She especially gets joy from working with other like-minded people who have a commitment to the cats' well-being and seeing the cats get adopted to good homes. Additionally, working with



people who purchase StreetCat spay/neuter/vaccination vouchers and the veterinary clinics that help with our program is very important for the very many homeless cats on the streets. In 2021 she issued out about 650 vouchers, but some years it is 1000+.

We are glad to have Vicki as one of our many talented and dedicated volunteers

Important Tips for Outside Kittens

- Do not leave food for the mother near where she has the kittens. That draws wildlife and other cats to the site which threaten the lives of the kittens. She has put them safely away from any food sources on purpose.
- If you are fairly certain that the kittens have been abandoned, put a border of flour around the kittens and leave the area (mom may be watching you watch for her) for several hours and then come back and look for prints in the flour.
- Keep in mind that if you take away the kittens without the momma cat, that she will soon be pregnant again and there will just be more kittens. If the kittens are healthy, leave them with their mom and contact StreetCats for a voucher so that you can get the mother spayed quickly before she is pregnant again.
- Remember, for tiny kittens... **MOTHER KNOWS BEST!** She feeds them and keeps them warm and safe. Their best chance for survival is to stay with mom!
- Know that there are not enough resources in Tulsa to bottle feed and care for all of the kittens that will be born to unowned cats. **They stand a better chance with their mothers.**
- For older kittens, if they are not friendly, they can be Trapped-Neutered-Vaccinated- and Returned so that their momma can teach them how to survive as community cats.

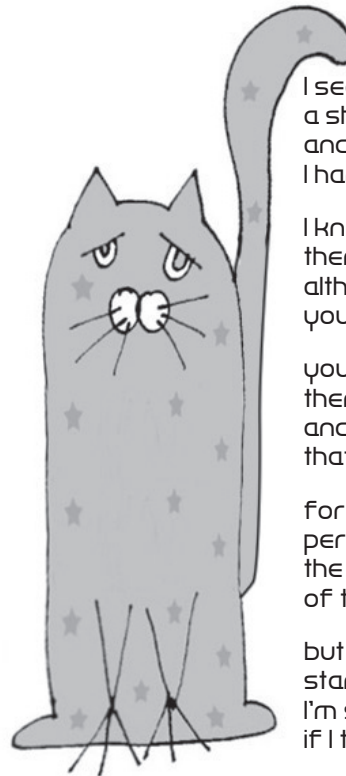
