# Vet checks keep kitties healthy

Does your cat get a regular visit to the vet each year?

Statistics show that within the first year of adoption, 80 percent of cats are actually seen one time by a veterinarian.

Unfortunately, after that first year, less than half of the cats return regularly to the vet.

Lack of veterinary intervention often becomes the reason behind what is perceived by owners as "behavior" problems in their cat. Many of these behaviors are healthrelated

issues, rather than "behavioral."

The sad fact is that untreated

The sad fact is that untreated medical conditions, misinterpreted by owners as "behavioral" problems, are the primary reason a large number of cats are given up or even put out on the



There are myriad reasons cats should be seen by their veterinarian at least annually.

Consider these veterinary guidelines: Adults up to age 8 should be seen by their vet once per year; senior cats (over 9 years old) should be seen twice per year. Annual vaccinations, even for inside cats, should be discussed with your vet.

## Q. Why does my cat NEED a regular vet visit?

Since their lifespan is shorter than a human's, they are aging much more rapidly. Therefore, an effort must be made to stay on top of their health.

A cat at one year of age has physically matured to 25 years! Just imagine if you were 25 years

old and had rarely seen a doctor. Owners often fail to identify the state of their cat's health as the reason for many common behavior problems. For example, many cats have suffered from serious and painful urinary tract infections for months while the owner believes the cat is just not using the litterbox because it is mad at them or is being vengeful!

#### Q. Why do many owners not take their cat for a regular vet visit?

One of the main reasons cited is one that the owner can take control of: the "pre-visit experience" — that is, the rounding

The most up-to-date HD-SDI cameras have been installed so we get a clear picture from a computer at home or in StreetCats or on smart phones.


So, smile when you are coming in or leaving Street-Cats —you're on candid camera!

up of the cat and getting him/her into the carrier.

Sixty percent of cat owners say their cat "hates" going to the vet. However, the pets may be reflecting the owner's emotional state. In fact, 38 percent of cat owners say they get stressed out themselves "just thinking" about taking their cat to the vet.

A website with great tips for improving this pre-visit experience is *catvets.com*. It addresses how to choose a carrier, using the carrier, and traveling with the cat, among other things to make visits more pleasant and less anxiety-inducing.

### Q. What are my benefits as a cat owner in seeing a vet?

Vets can educate owners about how cats think and what conditions are normal for their cats as they age. When a cat is seen on a regular basis, it is easier to identify changes in the cat's condition or behavior. It is very important to see a vet that is experienced, however, in working with cats. Some veterinary practices tend to work primarily with dogs and may not be as well-versed in feline medicine.

If you don't have a vet you and your cat are comfortable with, it is a good idea to ask friends with cats who they like as a vet or ask a local feline rescue group for a referral.

You can also check catvets.

com, which is hosted by the American Society of Feline Practitioners, for a list of members in your area. A great feline veterinarian doesn't have to be the priciest in town; just one that has the experience and demeanor to handle a cat and how to read behavior.

# Q. What is the danger in not taking my cat to the vet on a regular basis?

Cats are very good at concealing symptoms of pain and discomfort. They often don't let on that anything is bothering them until way past the time when owners should be intervening and seeking medical care. For example, human dental needs and cat dental needs are very similar. We know how much it hurts when we have a toothache, but cats can have painful problems with their teeth and mouth and still be eating.

By the time they stop eating, there may be secondary problems that need to be addressed that could even require hospitalization. The same goes for unnoticed weight loss, change in litterbox habits, excessive drinking — all can point to problems your veterinarian might have identified in an annual visit before the problem became acute and possibly not survivable later.

Cats are our family members! They should see a veterinarian at least once a year, just like humans should visit their doctors.

# StreetCats gears up for My Furry Valentine

Do you have a furry little angel in your life? Meet some of our sweet kitties!




"She's gorgeous!" is the first thing people when say they Reba. She's
